

DATA PRIVACY NOTICE

The Parochial Church Council (PCC) of St. Gregory the Great, Horfield

1. Your personal data – what is it?

Personal data relates to a living individual who can be identified from that data. Identification can be by the information alone or in conjunction with any other information in the data controller's possession or likely to come into such possession. The processing of personal data is governed by the General data Protection Regulation (the "GDPR")

2. Who are we?

The Parochial Church Council of St Gregory the Great, works with the Vicar of the parish. It decides how your personal data is processed and for what purposes. This also covers its use by the Parish Priest who is the Chair of the PCC.

3. How do we process your personal data?

The PCC of St Gregory the Great, Horfield complies with its obligations under the "DGPR" by keeping personal data up to date; by storing and destroying it securely; by not collection or retaining excessive amounts of data; by protecting personal data from loss; misuse, unauthorised access and disclosure and by ensuring that appropriate technical measures are in place to protect personal data.

We use your personal data for the following purposes:

- a) For members of the clergy to provide pastoral care to the parishioners
- b) For the PCC to administer electoral roll records
- c) For the PCC to fundraise and promote the interests of St. Gregory the Great, Horfield
- d) For the PCC to manage our employees and volunteers
- e) For the PCC to maintain our own accounts and records (including the processing of gift aid applications)
- f) For the PCC to inform you of news, events, activities and services running at St. Gregory the Great, Horfield
- g) For the PCC to share your contact details with the Diocesan office so they can keep you informed about news in the diocese and events, activities and services that will be occurring in the diocese and in which you may be interested.

4. What is the legal basis for processing your personal data?

- a) Explicit consent of the data subject so that we can keep you informed about news, events, activities and services and process your gift aid donations and keep you informed about diocesan events.
- b) Processing is necessary for carrying out obligations under employment, social security or social protection law, or a collective agreement
- c) Processing is carried out by a not-for-profit body with a philosophical and religious aim provided:

- (i) The processing relates only to members or former members (or those who have regular contact with it in connection with those purposes);
- (ii) And there is no disclosure to a third party without consent

5. Sharing your personal data

Your personal data will be treated as strictly confidential and will only be shared with other members of the church in order to carry out a service to other church members or for purposes connected with the church. We will only share your data with third parties outside of the parish with your consent.

6. How long do we keep your personal data?

We keep data in accordance with the guidance set out in the guide “Keep or Bin: Care of your Parish Records”, which is available from the Church of England website (see footnote for link)

Specifically, we retain electoral roll data while it is still current; gift aid declarations and associated paperwork for up to 6 years after the calendar year to which they relate; and parish registers (baptisms; marriage; funerals) permanently.

7. Your rights and your personal data

- a) The right to request a copy of your personal data which the PCC of St. Gregory the Great, Horfield, holds about you.
- b) The right to request that the PCC of St Gregory the Great, Horfield, corrects any personal data if it is found to be inaccurate or out of date.
- c) The right to request your personal data is erased where it is no longer necessary for the PCC of St. Gregory the Great, Horfield
- d) The right to withdraw your consent to the processing at any time
- e) The right to request that the data controller provide the data subject with his/her personal data and where possible, to transmit that data directly to another data controller, (known as the right to data portability); (where applicable) (*This only applies where the processing is based on consent or is necessary for the performance of a contract with data subject and in either case the data controller processes the data by automated means*)
- f) The right, where there is a dispute in relation to the accuracy or processing of your personal data, to request a restriction is placed on further processing
- g) The right to object to the processing of personal data (where applicable) (*This only applies where processing is based on legitimate interests – or the performance of a task in the public interest/exercise of official authority – direct marketing and processing for the purposes of scientific/historical research and statistics*)
- h) The right to lodge a complaint with the information Commissioners’ Office

8. Further processing

If we wish to use your personal data for a new purpose, not covered by this Data Protection Notice, then we will provide you with a new notice explaining this new use prior to commencing the processing and setting out the relevant purposes and processing conditions. Where and whenever necessary, we will seek your prior consent to the new processing.
